Topic outcomes	that Christians believe that the Bible is the inspired word of God. that there are many translations of the Bible. that the Bible guides Christians and effects their daily lives. about the origin and content of holy books from the world faiths I have investigated and the impact of these scriptures on the lives of believers. By the end of this unit pupils will know that there are several different genres of writing in the Bible. there are many translations of the Bible in English and other languages. the Bible is used to help answer questions about creation, truth, suffering and death, values for life and ethical issues. each world faith has a holy book that teaches, guides and impacts on the daily life of believers. Christians believe that the Bible is the inspired word of God. the Bible gives guidance for Christian living and this impacts on believers lives and communities. make links between Bible passages and Christian values, attitudes and beliefs. use religious language to ask relevant questions. talk about the work and perseverance of Bible translators. describe what inspires and influences them. describe the impact of the content of the Bible on believers' lives. use religious vecabulary to show understanding of religious texts. make comparisons between the holy books of at least three world faiths including the Bible. ask good questions that improve my learning. tell you about the work of Bible translators today and in the past. describe how what I have learnt inspires and influences me. describe the impact of the content of the Bible on a believer's life. use religious vecabulary to show I understand texts from the holy books I have investigated including the Bible. recognise and talk about the similarities and differences between holy books. explain how the teaching in the Bible ends to answer ultimate and ethical questions. that the nativity story is found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke, the true meaning of Christmas is a celebration of the birth of Jesus, the Son of God, Messiah. where the nativ	I know that the Exodus is a significant event in Jewish and Christian history. that the Seder is the special meal celebrated by Jews on the first evening of the festival of Passover. that Christianity is rooted in Judaism and Jesus celebrated the Passover. that for Jewish people the events of the Exodus and Passover are very important. that Christians remember the Passover and the Last Supper during the Eucharist.  retell the Exodus story highlighting the connections to the Seder meal. make links between the Passover, Last Supper and the Eucharist. tell you why Passover is a festival of memory and freedom. express my opinions about freedom, what it is and what it is not. tell you about the similarities and differences between the importance placed on the Passover by Jews and Christians. explain why the Passover is not forgotten that the Eucharist is an important celebration. that the Eucharist is celebrated by Christians worldwide. that there is a direct link between the life and words of Jesus and the Eucharist make links between Christian beliefs, the Eucharist and the Last Supper. use good religious vocabulary to show understanding of why Christians celebrate the Eucharist. identify the similarities and differences within and between the way Christian denominations celebrate the Eucharist. talk about the way in which the Eucharist service answers questions about Christian beliefs. explain what the words remembrance, holy, scarifice, mercy, salvation and faith mean to Christians and to me.	I know the stories of significant women in the Old Testament. the Jewish Festival of Purim celebrates how God used Esther to save his people. that being a person of faith isn't always easy.  respond sensitively to questions about my own experiences and those of others. make a link between my own values and the values and commitments of the women in the Bible.  use religious vocabulary to show that I understand the actions and beliefs of the women in the Old Testament.  ask good questions and suggest answers about belonging, commitment, truth and values. talk about the impact the lives of the women whose stories we explored had on God's great salvation plan. describe what inspires me about the lives of the women in the Bible. that Christians believe God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the Trinity. that Bible stories are used to answer questions about God and can talk about them. that there are similarities and differences between the names given to God by people of all world faiths.  retell Bible stories that reveal the nature and characteristics of God. talk with understanding and use religious language to explain the Trinity. identify Christian beliefs about God in prayers and worship songs. express my own opinion and ask big questions. identify the similarities and differences between beliefs about God across world faiths.

Topic outcomes	that Christians, Muslims and Hindus believe that God created the world. the creation stories which are at the beginning of the Bible.  talk about ways in which we can all help to take care of the world. talk about how Christians, Muslims and Hindus believe that creation shows the power and wonder of God. talk about being creative and what I enjoy doing when I am creative. look around me and wonder how amazing God's creation is. talk about what I enjoy most in creation. that the wise men visited Jesus after the shepherds. that Christians believe that Jesus is a gift from God.  retell the nativity story. talk about giving and receiving gifts. talk about Christians believing that Jesus is God's son. People of world faiths welcome new babies in special ways. The words of the call to prayer are whispered in the ear of new born Muslim babies. Giving babies a meaningful name is important to people of faith. Talk about what belonging means to them. Use religious vocabulary such as vicar, priest, font, baptism church and prayer. Tell you about what happens when a baby is baptised. Talk about the ways in which people of world faiths welcome new babies. Talk about why there are dates and honey in your chatterbox. Talk about why sometimes hair is shaved from the new-born's head.

Topic outcomes	I know that harvest is celebrated by people of all faiths and none. harvest is mentioned throughout the Old Testament. there is a connection between Christian belief and behaviour in relation to celebrating the harvest.  describe and recognise similarities between different religious harvest festivals express their own opinion as to why communities celebrate Harvest. talk about the differences between my world and Jesus world. use a Bible story to show the differences and similarities between my world and Jesus world. Ask good questions and talk about my experiences. that Jesus is called Emmanuel and that means God with us. that Christians believe Jesus is God's son. that Christians believe the presence of God changes lives.  describe the ways in which Christians believe that their actions show Jesus' presence in the world. ask good questions. make links between my experience and the experience of others	that not all church buildings are the same but have similar features according to denomination. that Peter and the disciples 'built' the church after the events of Pentecost. that the Bible gives guidance to the church about behaviour and attitudes and I can talk about what that guidance is. that Christianity is a world-wide multi-cultural faith. world faiths have different places of worship and I can name the buildings, key features and the worship that takes place there. that the Hindu murtis (statues) are expressions of god and that they are not worshipped as they are a focus to enhance worship. that the symbol of light is used in several religions. that the features of the building can be connected to the Holy Scripture of that faith. the Imam is the leader of the Mosque. the Rabbi is the leader of the Synagogue. use religious vocabulary to name features of the church building, talk about their significance and links to the Bible. Identify similarities and differences between demoninations worldwide. ask good questions about the similarities and differences between different denominational practices. make links between values and beliefs and behaviour. talk knowledgeably about places of worship. The features of the building and the worship that takes place there. that trust and forgiveness are key Christian values. that Christians believe that they can trust Jesus. that the events of Holy Week and Easter are key to understanding what Jesus came to earth to do. that the incidents of betrayal and trust are significant. Talk about and describe feelings in relation to situations of victory; make links between people's values and commitments and their attitudes and behaviour with regard to situations of victory. Ask important questions about Christian belief; reflect thoughtfully on the answers to these big questions. Describe the impact of belief in the Easter story on a person's life	the stories of Daniel and Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. that Bible stories reveal the nature of God. about persecuted Christians and the challenges, they face. talk knowledgeably about Christians being persecuted. talk about the ways in which the stories in the Bible encourage and motivate believer's prayer is a way of communicating with God.  prayer is an important part of the life of a believer.  that Christian people try to live out the teaching of the Bible and follow Jesus' example. that Christians try to build God's kingdom through their words and actions. the names and life stories of a few extraordinary people of faith. some similarities and differences between the ways in which people of faith. tive.  tell you who, from the people we have studied, inspires me and why.
